Over the last twenty-two years, the Navy SEAL Foundation has worked diligently and purposefully to support, protect, and empower the Naval Special Warfare (NSW) community, its families, veterans, and our Gold Star and Surviving Family members. Through the generosity of our donors, we've delivered more than \$134 million in direct support through our tailored programs, and we've maintained Charity Navigator's highest 4-star rating and "Perfect 100" for our transparency, nonprofit governance, and fiscal responsibility while doing so*. I speak for the entire NSF team when I say that it is an honor to do the work we do, and every bit of it matters so much to the warriors and families we help. Thank you for supporting our mission.

Last year, NSF delivered **\$18.9 million** in programmatic support, an increase of more than 36% over 2020. We were delighted to bring back many of our programs and events that were canceled or postponed in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, including our specialized summer camps and Gold Star and Surviving Family wellness retreats. In 2021, our team managed hundreds of support requests from the NSW community, and our Foundation committed to expanding our life-changing Warrior Fitness Program by opening a second location on the West coast to serve more SEALs and SWCCs in need of this comprehensive program.

In this 2021 annual report, you'll find information about our five areas of impact and how NSF's programs cultivate Strength, Resilience, Health, Education, and Community. You'll see our audited financial statements, spending charts, fundraising ratios, and information about our leadership and staff. 

Enhancing Physical & Mental Wellness

Life in NSW can take its toll on our warriors and their families, both physically and mentally. When an active duty SEAL or SWCC is injured or becomes critically ill, programs under our Health Pillar provide financial and logistical support so the focus can be on healing. We also provide assistance when family members become critically ill. In addition, many of our service members and veterans deal with the chronic effects of sustained combat.

NSF provides a specialized program aimed at addressing their unique physical and mental concerns while optimizing their quality of life. We also maintain connections to clinical psychologists skilled in addressing their specific mental health issues and have access to cutting-edge treatment modalities.

Providing Scholarships & Development Opportunities

Scholarships for the warriors and families of NSW was the first program the Foundation provided back in 2000. Since that time, we have never forgotten that access to exceptional education is a cornerstone of success. Programs under our Education Pillar empower active duty NSW personnel, their spouses and children, as well as SEAL and SWCC post-9/11 veterans, and the spouses and children of post-9/11 retirees, by awarding scholarships for higher education. We also support quality education options for dependent children in geographically separated duty locations where choices matter to the student's overall success. NSF provides funding for standardized college entrance exams for qualified applicants, and we facilitate the use of top-tier programs like SFALKIDS and Gratitude Initiative.

NSF's educational support augments funding accessible through Navy programs and provides additional financial resources that would not otherwise be available. The support of our mission helps guarantee members of the NSW community that they can pursue educational goals that are crucial to their success.



The Navy SEAL Foundation executes its mission with transparency and efficiency. Each year the Foundation is independently audited by RSM US LLP, one of the United States' most respected audit firms with its own rich history of integrity and due diligence. NSF's key financials, including IRS filings, are available by request or by visiting the Foundation's website: navySEALfoundation.org.

Since 2009, the Navy SEAL Foundation has maintained the highest four-out-of-four star rating from Charity Navigator, the number one charity evaluation organization in America. Charity Navigator carefully analyzes the financial efficiency and administrative accountability of over 195,000 nonprofit organizations and reports their findings at charitynavigator. org. The Navy SEAL Foundation has also maintained a 'Perfect 100' score from Charity Navigator since 2014, placing it in the top 0.1% of all rated charities.

Additionally, NSF is listed as one of "America's Best Charities," and is a Platinum Level member of the CANDID Guidestar Exchange, a title that can only be achieved through accurate and timely reporting of financials and programmatic impact.

Ninety-three cents of every dollar donated to the Foundation in 2021 was used to support programmatic initiatives for the Naval Special Warfare (NSW) community or was retained for future mission use, including long-term program support for Gold Star and Surviving Families.* In 2021, the Foundation invested \$18.9 million in programs for SEALs, SWCCs, NSW support personnel, their families, the families of the fallen, and SEAL and SWCC veterans.

An all-volunteer Board of Directors composed of a majority of former SEALs and NSW community members governs the Foundation and is Chaired by retired SEAL Vice Admiral Robert S. Harward, Jr. NSF executes its daily mission under the leadership and guidance of Chief Executive Officer Robin King.


